

Incoming 7th Grade Immunization Requirements

There are two additional vaccines that are required for incoming 7th graders:

- Tetanus Booster (TDap)
- Meningitis (MCV) vaccine.

These shots are not given until the child turns 11 years old and are not required until 7th grade.

As a reminder, your student will not be able to attend school in the Fall of 2025 until all immunizations are updated!

Please make sure that your child has received the additional immunizations, <u>AND</u> that the updated record is on file with Wertheimer Nurse's Clinic **BEFORE THE END OF THIS SCHOOL YEAR**.




