## **Judge Thomas Culver Elementary**

<u>Title I, Part A, Parent and Family Engagement Policy</u>

- 5. <u>Culver</u> will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
- meeting with parents, sending home emails, mail or call outs in English and Spanish
- sharing information on teachers' Canvas announcement pages
- 6. <u>Culver</u> will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
- student's reports will be accessible in Skyward Family
- parents will have access to their student's state assessment results in the Texas Assessment Student Portal at texasassessment.gov

- 7. <u>Culver</u> will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph –
- the state's academic content standards,
- the state's student academic achievement standards,
- the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- the requirements of Part A,
- how to monitor their child's progress, and
- how to work with educators:
- parent conferences, aiding parents about student's progress
- 8. <u>Culver</u> will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
- providing information on how to access and utilize Skyward and Canvas
- providing training based on parents' needs
- 9. <u>Culver</u> will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
- Providing training and staff development meetings regarding parent involvement and meaningful partnership.
