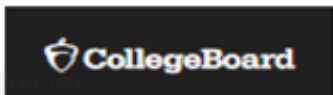
- 1.2 Multiplier

- PAP are Pre-Advanced Academics courses (non-College Board)
- Grades 6-12

Advanced Placement (AP)

- 1.3 Multiplier
- College Credit based on exam score
- HS gradebook only
- Grades 9-12

Dual Credit

- 1.3 Multiplier
- College credit based upon college grade
- HS and College Gradebooks
- Grades 11-12

Definition

- AP Courses are “rigorous, college-level classes in a variety of subjects that give students the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school by scoring a 3 or higher (5-point scale) on the AP exam associated with that course.”
- PAP Courses are Pre-Advanced Placement (PAP) courses are more complex and abstract. The courses emphasize the academic study and performance skills to help prepare or continue the advanced learner to successfully complete the Advanced Placement (AP) classes in that subject area.



Educational Benefits

- Preparation for College
- Potential to earn college credit (AP)
- Accelerating Towards a degree
- Weighted GPA- 1.3 for AP Courses-1.2 for PAP courses
- AP courses enhance scholarship applications



Prerequisites

- Vary by course and may require prior coursework
- Open enrollment policy that allows all interested students to participate.
- Teacher recommendations are not required



Costs for Enrolling

There are no costs for enrolling , but exam fees do apply.
All students enrolled are expected to take the AP exams.



AP Exam Fees



- \$103.00 *per* AP exam/\$30.00 for students on FRL
- \$153.00 for AP Capstone (Research/Seminar) - \$70.00 for FRL for AP Capstone Students
- Title I campuses- Exam fees are covered



Teachers

- All AP and PAP courses are taught by certified teachers
- Numerous additional developmental opportunities provided through College Board for educators

May 5-9, 2025 and May 12-16, 2025

Late Testing AP Exam administration

May 19-23, 2025

Students have one opportunity to take the exam for college credit
