Course Selection

- What does it look like?
 - FHS Counselors provide students with exact courses they will select in the Career Plan
 - Counselors will meet with students in Computer Labs to input their courses to the Career Plan. Levels will be reviewed (i.e. English 3 is academic, AP, or Dual Credit)
 - Once the Career Plan locks, Counselors print each student's course selections and begin meeting with students one-on-one to verify the selections are accurate and appropriate.

- Grades 9-12


