## On-Campus Students-Reminders

### Car Rider Drop-Off

All students must be dropped off at the front of Roberts and enter through the front doors. We will have staff out front to help and welcome all students. Doors open at 7:30.

### Car Rider Pick-Up

All students who are car riders must be picked up in the front of Roberts Middle School through the car rider line. Car riders must exit through the front doors of Roberts and wait for their ride in the car rider line. We will call your child's name for them to load into your car. Please be patient as this will be a slow process the first few days until students learn the system. We must social distance at dismissal so students will not be allowed to leave the building all at once.

### Siblings of HS Student Drivers

We will walk students to Fulshear HS who need to ride home with an older sibling.

### Bus Riders

Please go to the LCISD website. At the top of the page click on the Find My Bus/School link. Then click on bus route information. It will prompt you to select a grade, enter address information, and then click on the 'find school/transportation information' button. This will tell you the location/time of the pick-up in the AM and drop-off in the PM, along with the bus number.

### Reminders for Virtual Learners-

Lamar CISD expectations for asynchronous (online without real-time interaction) virtual instruction:

- Complete asynchronous activities assigned each day.
- Students show proof of participation in daily virtual instruction by satisfactorily completing assigned activities to demonstrate evidence of student learning (i.e. video, picture or activities submitted as lessons and/or completing assignments). Please note, not all lessons must have an assignment, as there will be teacher discretion on the number of assignments, as they follow the Lamar CISD grading guidelines.
- Students and parents will communicate with the teacher when needing additional assistance, tutoring, etc.

Lamar CISD expectations for synchronous (real-time) virtual instruction classes:

- Students will participate in synchronous class activities as assigned.
- Students will follow the Lamar CISD dress code (uniform dress is not required).
- Students are ready to learn.
- Workspace is designated for the student.
- Students will show their face on the screen to engage with the teacher virtually.
- Students will sign in to Zoom with their first name and last initial.
- Students will actively participate in the class.
- Students will follow the District Code of Conduct.

### Instructional Day and Attendance

Teachers will structure the instructional day to follow their campus bell schedule. Daily asynchronous learning activities will be required for each course. These daily activities, and any accompanying assignments must be completed by 11:59 p.m., or the student will be counted absent from the class for the day.

In addition to completing the daily asynchronous learning activities, students will be expected to participate in synchronous Zoom classes twice per week for each course in which they are enrolled. If a student is unable to attend, they must contact their teacher in advance for a make-up opportunity or risk being counted absent. A staggered weekly schedule of Zoom classes will be provided by the campus.

## Protocols for Face Coverings

Protective measures, including the use of face coverings, will be determined by risk level of COVID-19. The District will rely on data from the Department of State Health Services (DSHS), Fort Bend County Health & Human Services and the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to determine the risk level and the appropriate protective measures. The risk level categories below are based on the recommendations of Fort Bend County Health & Human Services. The District will alert students, parents and staff of the weekly COVID-19 risk level and when face coverings must be worn.

Acceptable face coverings in Lamar CISD include non-medical and medical grade disposable face masks, cloth face coverings (over the nose and mouth), and neck gaiters that cover the nose, mouth and neck.

### COVID-19 Risk Levels

<b>High Risk</b> <i>Mask Required</i>	High potential for exposure to known or suspected sources of COVID-19.
<b>Moderate Risk</b> <i>Mask Required</i>	High potential for exposure to known or suspected sources of COVID-19.
<b>Low Risk</b> <i>Masks Required</i>	Frequent/close contact with people who may be infected, but who are not known to be infected.
<b>New Normal</b> <i>Mask Optional</i>	Minimal and controlled level of COVID-19 new chains of transmission have been limited.

## Important Updates from Nurse Stubbs



**If a student is waiting for COVID test results - please keep student home, until results are received.**

**Do not send students to school, who are waiting on COVID test results.**

**ALL students must bring two (2) masks to school.**

**Students must be wearing one mask, as they enter school or bus.**

**And keep a second in their backpack, in case the 1st one breaks, lost or otherwise misplaced.**

# James W. Roberts

James W. Roberts was born Sept. 19, 1934, in Waco, Texas. After graduating from Waco High School in 1953, Roberts served two years in the United States Navy. Upon returning home from the Navy, Roberts attended Baylor University and graduated in 1961 with a degree in Education. His career in education began as a World History teacher and coach, spending his summers as a Youth Director at the Waco State Children's Home. From the very beginning, it was abundantly clear that Roberts' two passions were education and serving others.

Following his years in the classroom, Roberts started in the textbook industry. For years, Roberts specialized in teaching workshops on early detection of learning disabilities in kindergarteners, supported the prison system with books for their GED programs and worked with various school districts on textbook adoptions. He believed that each person had their own individual style of learning and wanted to embrace each unique learning style and help others recognize their abilities.

In 1969, Roberts and his wife Martha packed up and moved to Fulshear, TX. Two years after relocating to Fulshear, Roberts joined the Fort Bend Library Board where he served Fort Bend County diligently for 19 years and was on the forefront of helping to secure funds for George Memorial Library. While serving on the Library Board, Roberts found himself faced with another project to better his community. After realizing that Fulshear residents had a water and sewage problem, he set out to obtain grants for the necessary repairs. However, grants for these repairs were only available to incorporated cities. Thanks to Roberts' foresight, the process of incorporation was initiated and Fulshear became an incorporated city eligible for water and sewer funding in 1978. He was then elected the first Mayor of the new city and worked to establish the city of Fulshear's police department and secure land for the city's first school, Huggins Elementary. During this busy time Roberts ventured as an entrepreneur, leaving the textbook business to start his own sales agency for industrial supplies, J.W. Roberts Company.

In 1980, Roberts was elected to the Lamar CISD Board of Trustees where he served a total of 12 years, nine of which he served as president. While on the Board, Roberts helped Lamar CISD welcome four elementary schools, a middle and high school, the District's first natatorium and the Lamar CISD administration building. He did everything in his power to not only meet the needs of the District, but continually surpass them.

He worked tirelessly to serve his community and balance his roles as a business leader and decision maker for Lamar CISD. From 2006 to 2010, Roberts served his second term as Mayor of Fulshear before moving to Brenham, TX where he and his wife Martha currently reside. Martha, also an educator, taught for seventeen years, eleven in LCISD. James and Martha have three grown children and nine grandchildren. Roberts' commitment to education, his family and community continues to be undeniable. Where others may have seen a problem and said, "someone should do something about that," Roberts was the one to say, "I should do something about that." Which he did- time and time again.

James W. Roberts Middle School opened in August 2019. We hope to carry on James Roberts' legacy of community service, passion for education, selflessness and hard work.

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Any article of clothing or grooming the principal or designee determines inappropriate, a safety concern, or can reasonably be expected to cause disruption or interference with normal school operations is prohibited.

**TRAFFIC FLOW DIAGRAM**






1. Login to the Skyward Family Access Center and click on the "Portfolio" menu option.
