# Title I, Part A Parent and Family Engagement Policy for Arredondo Elementary School

#### 2020-2021

## Revised September 17, 2020

Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), Section 1116(b)(1), requires that each Title I, Part A school shall jointly develop with, and distribute to, parents and family members of participating children a written parent and family engagement policy, agreed on by such parents, that shall describe the means for carrying out the requirements of subsections (c) through (f). #### PART I. GENERAL EXPECTATIONS

Arredondo Elementary agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

- Consistent with section 1116, the school will work to ensure that the required school level parental involvement policies meet the requirements of section 1116 of the ESSA, and each include, as a component, a school-parent compact consistent with section 1116(d)(2) of the ESSA.

# PART II. DESCRIPTION OF HOW SCHOOLS WILL IMPLEMENT REQUIRED SCHOOL PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT POLICY COMPONENTS

- 1. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development of its school parental involvement plan under section 1116 (c) (1) (2) of the ESSA:
  - meetings with PTO and site based team held monthly to review and revise the policy
- 2. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will take the following actions to involve parents in the process of school review and improvement under section 1116 (c) (1) (2) of the ESSA:
  - Site base meeting (parent, teacher and administration) a minimum of six times a year
  - Electronic options and suggestions form for families
- 3. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of

additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend. The school will invite all parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs to this meeting, and will encourage them to attend, by:

- holding an annual meeting to share the benefits that the program has for each child;
- helping with computer service
- helping with Skyward and Canvas access
- providing ESL support to students and parents.
- 4. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will provide parents of participating children information in a timely manner about Title I, Part A programs that includes a description and explanation of the school's curriculum, the forms of academic assessment used to measure children's progress, and the proficiency levels students are expected to meet by:
  - sharing the information during Open House
  - sharing the information during International Night (January)
  - sharing the information in Skyward
- 5. Arredondo Elementary will at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
  - meeting with parents, sending home emails, mail or call outs
- 6. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on the State assessment in at least math, language arts and reading by:
  - student reports will be sent home by mail once received from the state.
- 7. **Arredondo Elementary** will aid parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph --
  - the state's academic content standards.
  - the state's student academic achievement standards,
  - the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
  - the requirements of Part A,
  - how to monitor their child's progress, and
  - how to work with educators:
  - parent Conferences, aiding parents about student's progress

- 8. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
  - Offering computer training for Skyward, signing up for free Office 365, Canvas and providing additional training based on the parents' needs
- 9. <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools, by:
  - Providing training and staff development meeting regarding parent involvement and meaningful partnership.
- 10. Arredondo Elementary will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
  - The information related to the student is shared with the parents through our school website, Skylert call outs, email, Newsletters, AES on Facebook and Twitter, logging into our LCISD Skyward account.

### PART III. ADOPTION

This School Parental Involvement Policy has been developed jointly with, and agreed on with, parents of children participating in Title I, Part A programs, as evidenced by <u>AES Title 1 Principal and AES Parents.</u>

This policy was adopted by <u>Arredondo Elementary</u> in <u>September 2020</u> and will be in effect for the <u>2020-2021 School Year</u>. The school will distribute this policy to all parents of participating Title I, Part A children on or before <u>November 1, 2020</u>.
