<p>Welcome & Team Builder Jill Reed, DSIC Chair</p>	<p>Jill Reed welcomes the committee and reviews the agenda. Jill leads the committee through an ice break and introduces Dr. Rockwood.</p>
<p>2021 Demographic Report Dr. Mike Rockwood</p>	<p>Dr. Rockwood shares a presentation on our Demographic Report. Dr. Rockwood shares that the projection was affected by COVID. He shares that we have already surpassed our expected student growth in enrollment thus far this school year. He estimates that we are approximately one month behind in expected growth due to the pandemic. Dr. Rockwood shares that we are third in the area for the number of students added to our enrollment this year. Dr. Rockwood shows are growth for the past ten years. He shares facts about the Regional Economy including the loss/gain of jobs in our area. Dr. Rockwood shares about more specific jobs that have been or will soon be created locally. We currently have 38,000+ resident student and 36,000+ of those students attend LCISD. For single family housing, we are now #1 in new home starts. Dr. Rockwood continues to share a map and specific projections for various areas of our school district. For next school year we are projected to have 39,000+ students in enrollment. Dr. Rockwood shares elementary long-range planning and shares potential new campus needs in specific areas in our district. He then shares secondary campus needs to meet our growth in enrollment.</p> <p>Ms. Clark asked if there was a way to ensure that infrastructure is in place prior to a school opening. Mr. Junti shares that often times even though it is desired that state or local governments wait until there is a need to warrant a new road. He shares that they have been working closely with TXDOT to plan with them. However he shares that often times, yes there is lag and it will most likely be a few years before any changes will be made by TXDOT on roads.</p> <p>Chris Steubing asks if we reach out to other districts who have previously experienced growth to learn from them and work with them. Dr. Rockwood shares that we are a part of the Fast Growth Coalition. He shares that all fort bend county districts have a good relationship and share things that have worked well in relation to the growth.</p>

<p>2020-21 Climate Survey Dr. Mike Rockwood</p>	<p>Ms. Reed continues the meeting and introduces the climate survey that will be reviewed by Dr. Rockwood. Dr. Rockwood shares that this climate survey was completed prior to the winter break. It covers academic preparation, student support, school leadership, parent engagement, safety, etc. This year they did add some questions in regard to the districts COVID 19 response. 21, 467 stakeholders responded to the survey. 83% of our parents gave our campuses an A or a B. Dr. Rockwood did share that students are often tougher in giving feedback. Dr. Rockwood shares the results of the survey in response to how the district responded to COVID 19. Dr. Rockwood shares feedback from students and parents in regard to virtual learning if they participated in virtual learning. Dr. Rockwood then shares feedback from parents and students in regard to on campus instruction. Dr. Rockwood shares that the climate surveys are posted on the district website. You can visit each campuses website and it will be posted there as well as the district site.</p> <p>Dr. Rockwood opens for questions. No questions were asked.</p> <p>Dr. Rockwood shares that they (the cabinet/leadership) really appreciate the effort that their stakeholders took in completing the survey.</p> <p>(*see presentation for details – posted on lcid.org)</p>

<p>2021-22 DMA Revisions Dr. Kathleen Bowen</p>	<p>Ms. Reed introduced Dr. Bowen to review the DMA revisions.</p> <p>Dr. Bowen shares that there are DMA requirements that affect staff's ability to have the extra day off at Easter. However, she shares that now it no longer affects the ability for staff to renew their contract. She shares that you will have options if you do not complete the hours. This will take effect in the 21-22 school year.</p> <p>Ms. Wenglar asked if this affected OPT day and Dr. Bowen shared the OPT day is still there.</p> <p>Ms. Vincek shares that summer PD will be posted in Strive tomorrow for staff to register.</p>
<p>Q&A Dr. Thomas Randle</p>	<p>Dr. Randle shares that it has been a challenging year but that with the work we do that it is why so many people want to move to our district. He shares that is the stakeholder's dedication to getting through this school year. If you reflect back on this year we have had COVID and our ice storm URI. We started in person and virtual, we started our own police department, and completed a number of studies including compensation, all during a pandemic. He thanks each and every person in the district.</p> <p>A question was asked regarding virtual learning next year. Dr. Randle shared that they are looking at virtual learning but no decisions have been made thus far.</p>
