## **Title I, Part A Parent and Family Engagement Policy for**

## **Gray Elementary**

- 1. **<u>Gray Elementary</u>** will take the following actions to involve parents in the joint development and in process of school parental involvement plan under section 1116 (c) (1) (2) of the ESSA:
  - Site Base Decision-Making Team Meetings (parent, teacher and administration)
- 2. <u>**Gray Elementary**</u> will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. The school will convene the meeting at a time convenient for parents and will offer a flexible number of additional parental involvement meetings, such as in the morning or evening, so that as many parents as possible are able to attend.   - Hosting an annual meeting to share the benefits that the Title I program has for each child

  - Sharing the information during the annual Title I Meeting
  - Sharing the information electronically through newsletters and campus website
- 4. **<u>Gray Elementary</u>** will, at the request of parents, provide opportunities for regular meetings for parents to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions about the education of their children. The school will respond to any such suggestions as soon as practicably possible by:
  - *Meeting with parents, sending information electronically through newsletters and campus website*
- 5. **<u>Gray Elementary</u>** will provide each parent an individual student report about the performance of their child on:
  - State Assessments and access to student's grading reports in Skyward
- 6. <u>**Gray Elementary**</u> will help parents of child(ren) served by the school to understand the following topics as appropriate--

- the state's academic content standards,
- the state's student academic achievement standards,
- the state and local academic assessments including alternate assessments,
- the requirements of Part A,
- how to monitor their child's progress, and
- how to work with educators
- 7. **<u>Gray Elementary</u>** will provide materials and training to help parents work with their child(ren) to improve their academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by:
  - Offering computer training for Skyward, Canvas, and providing additional support based on the parents' needs
- 8. **<u>Gray Elementary</u>** will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs by building ties between parents and schools, by:
  - *Providing training and staff development meetings regarding parent involvement and meaningful partnership.*
- 9. **<u>Grav Elementary</u>** will take the following actions to ensure that information related to the school and parent-programs, meetings, and other activities is sent to parents of participating children in an understandable and uniform format, including alternative formats upon request, and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand:
  - The information related to the student is shared with the parents through our school website, email, newsletters, and social media platforms.
