- Jan. 31st Skyward Window for Course Selection closes




Course Selection Timeline Incoming 8th Grade




- *Students must be in PAP/GT Math in the 6th grade to take 7th Grade PAP/GT Math.

What is AVID?

- AVID is a course that ALL 7th grade students in LCISD must take. 8th Grade can choose this as an elective.
- This AVID advisory course will include opportunities to learn organizational and study skills, post-secondary and career exploration and preparedness, note taking strategies, and much more.

- Enhanced Thinking Skills: Pre-AP classes are designed to challenge students' thinking, encouraging them to develop critical thinking and problem-solving skills that are essential for success in higher education and beyond.
- College Preparation: Pre-AP courses lay the groundwork for future success in Advanced Placement (AP) and Dual-Credit courses, offering students the opportunity to earn college credits while still in high school.
- Engaging Learning Environment: These courses provide a stimulating environment that pushes students to engage more deeply with the material, fostering a love for learning and intellectual curiosity.
- Inclusivity in Learning: For students not taking Pre-AP, the alternative is often an inclusion class. Pre-AP offers a pathway to a more tailored and academically-focused environment.

Support for Student Athletes

•Eligibility Protection: Student-athletes have the opportunity to try Pre-AP with the assurance of one-time exemption eligibility, meaning they can retain their athletic eligibility even if they face challenges in the course.

Encouragement for Families

- •Opportunities for All Students: We encourage all students to attempt Pre-AP courses, as they are not necessarily more work but rather provide a more thought-provoking and enriching educational experience.
- •Supportive School Community: Our school is committed to supporting students who choose to take Pre-AP courses with additional resources and guidance to ensure their success.
- •Building Confidence: Trying a Pre-AP course can help build a student's confidence in their academic abilities, preparing them for future challenges.




JOURNALISM

- 8th graders may elect to take this course. Hands-on projects and cooperative learning will be utilized when available.






Electives for High School Credit

- Grade points are earned toward High School GPA grade point average for all high school credit courses in junior high.


